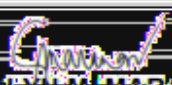

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES TO CONDUCT IMPACT ASSESSMENT

I. Background

Gender is

It involves consulting with both men and women, as well as other stakeholders, to understand their experiences and concerns. This approach helps to design more equitable and effective projects and policies.
